Where are the names?

There are, names, many names, but it is difficult to write six million names.

This is true: it is difficult to write, but one can remember. I, for example am named Judith, because my grandmother was called Judith. My grandmother was killed in the holocaust.

I am called David, because of my uncle. The German took him to a concentration camp. He didn't come back from there.

It is difficult to write the names of six million people. It is difficult to find details about each name.

But to remember - we can. This statue is in memory of all the mothers, and the baby is in memory of

all the babies who were killed in the Holocaust.

Come over here! Here there are names. Who are these people? Why here they wrote names_

These are the names of the of The Just among the Nations - these are the names of non Jews, who

saved the lives of Jews during the war. Here is the name of the righteous among the nations - Schindler.

He succeeded in saving the lives of 1400 Jews. They worked in a factory he founded, and he managed to convince the Nazis, that they must work in the factory, and so they were saved.

These people are different. Because of their deeds, they are remembered.

I always thought that the name David is so simple. I wanted to have a more interesting name, but now I am glad I'm called David.
